



# Sacrament of Baptism and Confirmation Role of Sponsors

A baptismal preparation class is mandatory for all parents who are requesting Baptism. Baptisms are scheduled with the Deacon. Please contact the rectory office for more information.

Godparent or Sponsor Requirement- You must be a practicing Catholic, in good standing, and attend mass regularly, (married validly if married), at least 16 years of age, and have received the sacraments of initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist). Requested eligibility Certificates for another Parish- We cannot issue certificates of eligibility to any parish if a person is not regularly attending Sunday mass and/or isn't properly registered in St. Joseph Parish .

**Sacrament of the Sick** In case of serious illness, please contact the Rectory or call the emergency number if after office hours.

#### Sacrament of Marriage

Parishioners planning a wedding, contact the office to book an available date at least six months or more prior to that date. Arrange for Marriage Preparation Class by contacting www.philamarriageprep.com or call 610-873-2017. Saturday weddings cannot be scheduled any later than 2:00PM. Non-parishioner weddings are up to the Pastor's discretion. If a couple is not a member of this parish, they should request a letter of permission from their 'home' parish.

#### Applying this week's Gospel

The most fundamental belief for the Jewish people is that there is only one God and their God, Yahweh, is that one God. The first commandment we heard in today's Gospel summarizes that foundational belief, but it also instructs Jewish people how they should respond to God. The commandment tells them to love God with "all your heart, all your soul, all your mind and all your strength." It does not say to love God with some of your heart, some of your soul, some of your mind or some of your strength. The commandment makes it perfectly clear that the only appropriate way to respond to such an awesome God is to love God completely and passionately. That is the way that each one of us ought to love God as well. This week, love God passionately.

#### OUR LADY OF THE THIRTY-THREE November 8

On April 19, 1825, thirty-three Uruguayan patriots fighting for independence placed the future of their new nation at the feet of an image of the Virgin in a small chapel. National independence was proclaimed on August 25, and the members of the Constitutional Court presented themselves again before the statue to place their nascent country under her protection. Ever since, this image has been known as *La Virgen de los Treinta y Tres*.

#### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Every four years, we engage in one of the core activities of our democratic system: a presidential election. Actually, the institution of election can be traced to traditions in the Church, and although bishops are no longer chosen in this way, abbots and abbesses (heads of monastic communities) have almost always been elected by full voting members of their communities. The lifetime appointment begins when the monks or nuns are gathered in "chapter" at the death or resignation of the abbot, and fortunately for all involved, campaigning is not allowed! The members of the community discern, with prayer to the Holy Spirit, who among them is the best suited for leadership. Once chosen, the new leader requests the blessing of the local bishop, who usually presides at a ceremony of consecration or investiture. The ballots are always secret, and a simple majority must be achieved.

In our American system the Electoral College is the determining voice in the presidential election, not the popular election on a November Tuesday, just as the monastic chapter is the electorate. Today, most religious orders elect general superiors in "chapter" by delegates of the professed members, and usually for a term of six years. A few, like the Jesuits, elect for life. At least we don't have that weight on our shoulders when we choose a president. Four years at a time will do! —Rev. James Field

#### **CELEBRATE ALL SOULS**

In this country All Souls it is a day of solemn and quiet remembrance of those who have "gone before us, marked with the sign of faith." For people of Hispanic heritage it is El Día de los Muertos (The Day of the Dead). It emphasizes celebration. People gather to pray and honor the memory of the dead. In Mexico, people visit cemeteries. They decorate their family gravesites and picnic nearby on favorite foods of departed loved ones. The Day of the Dead originated in Aztec culture. Native people joyfully celebrated the end of earthly life with dancing and feasting. Spanish conquistadors were horrified and tried to stamp this out, but Aztec customs gradually intertwined with the Catholic faith. Commemoration of All Souls helps us to recall those separated from us by death, to celebrate their lives and their importance to us, and to pray for them with thankful hearts.

#### **MODELS OF FAITH**

This feast of All Saints, November 1st celebrates holy examples of living faith-the saints. After the 1994 California earthquake, the Los Angeles Archdiocese decided to replace its ruined cathedral. Our Lady Queen of Angels Cathedral was dedicated in 2002. Artist John Nava was commissioned to design 25 tapestries of 135 people declared saints or beatified by the Church. After careful research, Nava painted larger-than-life portraits that were digitized and woven into tapestries. These make the saints seem to be present and very real. We Catholics are sometimes challenged by those who think that we worship the saints, but worship belongs to God alone. Representations of the saints are the Church's equivalent of a family photo album. We look through our albums and remember those we love who have left this life, we tell the stories about them-we may even speak to them in our hearts-and we may be truly inspired to follow the example of their earthly life.


